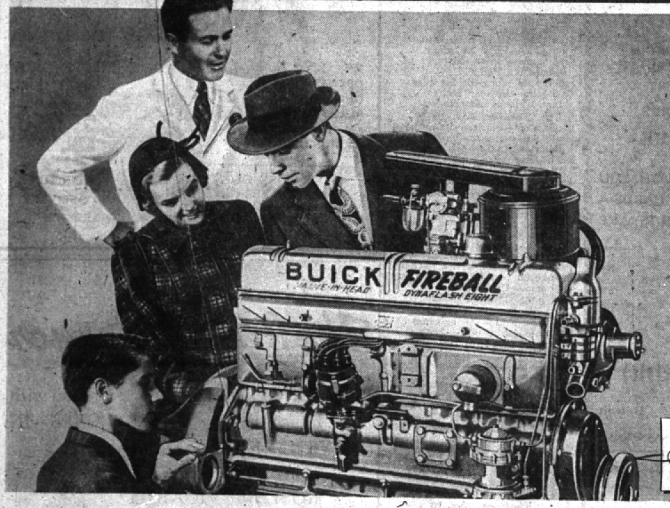
Baptist Church Crusade Begins This Sunday
