Needed: \$515 to Finance JCC Christmas Decoration Plan for Downtown Area

Downtown Birmingham may or may not be decorated with special effects for the Christmas season. It all depends upon the success of the local Junior Chamber of Commerce in finding a new "angle" for its proposed 40-day Christmas production.

The Jaycee's Christmas committee chairman, John F. Cole, Jr., was turned down Monday night by the city commission on his request that the city give the group \$515 to pay for lights, connections, mural, etc., which would be used to decorate downtown street light poles during the Christmas season.

"I'm in favor of giving the JCC permission to decorate the poles, but as for the money—that's a question mark," stated City Commissioner Garland Tait.

Others Voice Objections

Mayor Milton F. Mallender, Commissioners Bill Martin, Theron Van Dusen, Bruce Booth and Don Bell also voiced objections to the city providing decoration funds from the taxpayers' dollar.

"With the problems we know are still facing us, and what with continually rising costs of operation, I can't see where the city can afford to let \$515 go for this project," declared the Mayor.

Commissioner Bell pointed out a couple of other hidden items.

"Labor and equipment charges are also to be considered," Bell said. "This would mean well over \$1,000 by the time the city got through with the matter."
