**TURKEY TALK.** Thanksgiving time is here again and you're probably making mental notes of special ideas you'd like to remember to make this year's feast a never-to-be-forgotten occasion. Since the meal is built around the main dish, turkey, let's talk turkey.

First, a good guide in purchasing a bird is to allow about ¾ lb. of dressed turkey (minus head, feet and organs) for each person you plan to serve. For example, a 12-lb. turkey should serve about 15 people.

Prepare the bird for roasting by singeing it over a flame to remove pin feathers, clean, wash, and dry, and then stuff it.

No specific quantities are given for these ingredients because, naturally, the amounts vary with the size of the turkey. You'll need about 2 large-size loaves of day-old bread for a 12-lb. turkey. The other ingredients are used for flavoring, the exact amounts to be judged by your taste preference.

Day-old whole wheat white, or graham bread, toasted.  
Chopped celery  
Chopped onion  
Salt, pepper, paprika, poultry seasoning  
Melted butter

Shred bread or tear into small pieces, combine with celery, onion, seasonings, and melted butter. Fill the cavity lightly with dressing. You'll find it will be pleasantly moist when the bird is done. This may be varied by adding giblets, nuts, oysters, or mushrooms.

The turkey should be trussed by tying (use twine) the legs together and the wings flat against the sides. It is usually best to keep the dressing intact by sewing up the chest cavity with a needle and coarse thread, after stuffing. Brush the skin with salad oil or fat; or lay 2-3 slices of bacon over the breast.

Place on rack in a shallow roasting pan and roast according to the following chart. Do not baste or add water. Cut the twine from the legs to permit the drumsticks to become better cooked and browned.

ishes, etc., that the less serving dishes on the table, the more comfortable the meal will be.

Try serving steaming green garden peas, surrounded by a ring of green squash stuffed with tomato cereals, or perhaps a ring of thin green beans with golden buttered corn in the center. Be original and you'll achieve many cheerful combinations which will make your table attractive.

**Pumpkin Chiffon Pie**  
Most folks are too full of turkey and trimmings to do justice to a wedge of pumpkin pie, but it just doesn't seem like a Thanksgiving dinner without it. This is my favorite recipe for pumpkin pie, because it's so very light. It's always successful and doesn't require baking:

1½ cups canned pumpkin eggs separated  
½ cup sugar  
1 cup milk  
1 teaspoon salt  
1½ teaspoon ginger  
1½ teaspoon nutmeg  
1½ teaspoon cinnamon  
2 tablespoons melted shortening  
1½ teaspoon plain gelatin  
¼ cup cold water  
¼ cup sugar

Cook the pumpkin in the double boiler for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Mix the egg yolks, milk, and sugar together using an egg beater, then add the spices and melted shortening to this mixture. Pour this into the pumpkin, stirring and cooking until it thickens to custard consistency. Then remove it from the heat.

Soak the gelatin in cold water for 5 minutes and add to the pumpkin. Chill, and when slightly stiffened, gently fold into 3 stiffly beaten egg whites to which ½ cup of sugar has been added. Pour into a pre-baked pie shell or gingerbread lined pie plate (crust ingredients to fill in empty space).

**Holiday Dessert Cookies**

3 cups sifted all-purpose flour  
1½ teaspoon salt  
¾ cup shortening  
¾ cup butter or margarine  
cup confectioners' sugar  
1 tablespoon vanilla  
1 teaspoon almond extract  
cup chopped walnuts  
confectioners' sugar  
powdered cinnamon

Cream the shortening, butter, and confectioners' sugar until well blended. Add the flour and nuts, mixing together. Pour flour and salt. When combined, drop by the teaspoon or tablespoon on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 325° F. for 25 minutes. Roll in confectioners' sugar.

sugar and cinnamon while still hot. These cookies are especially attractive when made in the shape of fingers, by taking a tablespoonful of the dough and rolling it between the palms of the hands until it forms a long strip (about 1" x 1/2"). Refrigerate the dough if it is too soft to work with. Fields 2 1/2 dozen cookies. This dough may be made in advance and refrigerated overnight.

**Hints for Thanksgiving**

Put Pumpkin Chiffon Filling (see above) into separate glass dishes to chill. Top with whipped cream and serve with Holiday Dessert Cookies.

If you have some leftover dressing after you've stuffed the turkey, put it into a greased baking dish, spread it 1" thick and place mushrooms on top of it. Dot with butter and cream and bake for 15 minutes at 400° F.

Stuff the turkey the day before and figure out its weight and how long it will take to cook your Thanksgiving day cooking schedule ahead of time.

Have the neck of the turkey cut off and save it for making soup stock.

When the turkey is ready to serve, put it on a platter and place it on the table with the preliminary to the left of the carver.
