Bloomfield High Roms to 27-6 Win Over Detroit Team

Last Friday the Bloomfield Hills High School football team emerged victorious over the Detroit Country Day team by the score of 27 to 6. Since both teams had been undefeated this season until game time, and both the Bloomfield County Conference Championship and the winning of the D-B.H. Bronze Trophy were at stake, the game held more than normal crowd attended.

Bloomfield kicked off to Country Day, and the opening quarter went on about even terms until Bloomfield scored in the closing minutes. Bloomfield drove from their own 35 yard line on six successive plays to score. Eddie Burch plunged off-tackle for 28 yards and Howard Rogers, fullback, bucked over from the two yard line, to achieve this first score.

In the second quarter, Country Day received the kickoff but was unable to advance, and kicked on the fourth down. Vaughan's powerful running plays went unstoppped as Blake and Jack McGreggor combined to bring another touchdown. The try for extra point was good.

Day offense began to click with running and passing plays which brought them to the 15 yard line of Bloomfield. A 10 yard pass brought them their only touchdown.

The second half was all Bloomfield, sparked by McGregor and Blake. Blake made end runs of 15, 20 and 35 yards, as another touchdown was registered in the third quarter.

The last quarter saw McGregor Vaughn touchdown at 11 1/2 mile run around the left end for 30 yards, and the score was 26-0. Country Day fought desperately to get-back into the game, and began to throw passes which were intercepted at the critical times by an inspired Bloomfield eleven.
