NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a General Election will be held on **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 1948**, at the Bloomfield Township Office, 4200 Telegraph Rd., Bloomfield Hills. For the purpose of electing the following Officers:

Presidential: President and Vice-President of the United States.
State: Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Treasurer, Auditor General, Congressional United States Senator; Representative in Congress.
Legislative: State Senator; Representative in State Legislature.
County: Judge of Probate, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, Circuit Court Commissioner, Drain Commissioner, County Surveyor. Also for the purpose of voting upon the following propositions:

Proposition No. 1: Proposed Amendment to the Constitution Relative to the Order of Succession in the Performance and Duties of the Governor.
No. 1 A Joint Resolution of the 1947 Legislature proposing an amendment to Sections 16, 17, and 18 of Article 6 of the state constitution to the order of succession in the performance of the powers and duties of the governor, by providing for devolution of such powers and duties upon the lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state treasurer, and auditor general respectively; and to provide for such devolution in the event of death of a governor elect.

Proposition No. 2: Proposed Amendment to the Constitution Providing for the Recall of Section 23, Article 10.
No. 2 A Joint Resolution of the 1947 Legislature proposing an amendment to the state constitution providing for the recall and striking therefrom of Section 23 of Article 10 of the State Constitution relative to the return of one cent of a state sales tax levy to be divided among school districts, cities, townships and villages and providing for the making of annual grants to school district out of general funds.

Proposition No. 3: A Joint Resolution of the 1948 Extra Session of the Legislature proposing an amendment to Section 21 of Article 7 of the State Constitution, providing that the compensation of the governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, auditor general, and attorney general be determined by law.

Proposition No. 4: Proposed Amendment to the Constitution Relative to Compensation and Expenses of Members of the Legislature.
No. 4 A Joint Resolution of the 1948 Extra Session of the Legislature, proposing an amendment to Section 9 of Article 5 of the State Constitution, providing for the determination of the compensation and expenses of members of the legislature by law.

Proposition No. 5: Proposed Amendment to Section 21 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, So As to Modify the Fifteen-Minute Limitation.
Initiative petitions proposing an amendment to Section 21 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, so as to modify the fifteen-minute limitation to permit increase of limitation for a period of not to exceed twenty years, instead of five years, and to require a majority vote of the electors instead of a two-thirds vote to increase such limitation.

Proposition No. 6: Referendum of Act No. 270 of the Public Acts of 1947, Entitled "An Act to Regulate and Control the Operation of Foreign Agents Acting within the State of Michigan; and to Prescribe Penalties for Violations of the Provisions of this Act".
Petition for Referendum of Act No. 270 of the Public Acts of 1947, entitled "An Act to regulate and control the operation of foreign agents acting within the State of Michigan; and to prescribe penalties for violations of the provisions of this act."

General Revision of the Constitution.
Shall a convention for the purpose of a general revision of the Constitution be held?
