

## Newcomers Hear Mrs. Burlingame Talk on "Fun With Flowers"

Mrs. Wm. B. Burlingame, guest speaker at the Newcomers' Club luncheon, meeting last Thursday at the Community House, gave a talk and demonstration on "Fun With Flowers and Plants". Mrs. Burlingame traced the part played by flowers and plants from early days when they were used strictly for medicinal purposes to modern times, with entire magazines devoted to flowers for beauty and decoration.

"An interest in flowers and plants," Mrs. Burlingame said, "will help you make friends and may eventually lead to a livelihood."

Know Your Shrubs  
In outside planting, the speaker stressed the importance of

knowing your shrubs when planting, buying only reputable landscape stock, and care in spacing. Mrs. Burlingame showed the audience a home made tool holder.

Among other demonstration items given away were a set of books, a watering pot of bitter-sweet and greens, a trowel, and a pot of philodendron. The prize gift, a gray pottery bowl of roses and other flowers, was won by Mrs. John Richards.

Some Novel Ideas  
Mrs. Burlingame told of a way to wash plant leaves and gave a novel idea for laying out your garden plot with the aid of the garden hose. Many guests took notes on methods of propagation for forget-me-nots, chrysanthemums, delphinium, African violets and geraniums.

"Let your flowers and plants express you, whether inside or outside the house," Mrs. Burlingame advised. "Enjoy the pleasure of dramatizing your mantle at different times of the year, such as Valentine's Day, children's day, May day, the harvest season, New Year's and Christmas."

On Voting  
Preceding Mrs. Burlingame's speech, Mrs. F. C. Garrison, president of the League of Women Voters, gave a short talk on the importance of intelligent voting by women.

The Cossacks came to the States to sing at the San Francisco World's Fair and have been here ever since, singing from coast to coast and twice going overseas to perform for American troops.

Notice is hereby given that a General Election will be held in the City of Birmingham, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, on

at the place or places of holding the election in said city as indicated below, viz:

Precinct 2—Holy Name School, 820 Harmon Avenue  
Precinct 3—Adams School—Corner Adams and Oakland  
Precinct 4—Municipal Building, 151 Martin Street  
Precinct 5—Bell Funeral Home, 820 E. Maple—Garage—Elm Street  
Precinct 6—Pierce School, 1828 Pierce Street

For the purpose of electing the following officers, viz: President and Vice-President of the United States Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Treasurer, Auditor General, United States Senator, Representatives in Congress, Senator and Representatives in the State Legislature, and for Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, District Commissioner, County Surveyor, Judge of Probate, Circuit Court Commissioners

and to vote on the following propositions:

The question of calling and holding a Convention for the purpose of making a general revision of the Constitution pursuant to section 9 of article 4 of the Constitution of the United States; and the following proposed Constitutional Amendments:

Proposal No. 1. A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to sections 16, 17, and 18 of article 6 of the state constitution relative to the order of succession in the performance of the powers and duties of the Governor.

Proposal No. 2. A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution providing for the repeal and striking therefrom of section 23 of article 10 of the state constitution relative to the return of one cent of a state sales tax levied to be divided among school districts, cities, townships and villages and providing for the making of annual grants to school districts out of general fund.

Proposal No. 3. A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to section 21 of article 6 of the state constitution, providing that the compensation of the governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, auditor general, and attorney general be determined by law.

Proposal No. 4. A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to section 9 of article 4 of the state constitution, providing for the determination of the compensation and expenses of the legislature by law.

Proposal No. 5. Initiative petitions proposing an amendment to section 21 of article 10 of the state constitution so as to modify the fifteen mill limitation.

Proposal No. 6. Referendum of Act No. 270 of the Public Acts of 1947, entitled "An Act to regulate and control the operation of foreign agencies acting within the State of Michigan, and to prescribe penalties for violations of the provisions of this Act."

Election Law, Revision of 1946 (Section 3093) OPENING AND CLOSING OF POLLS: NOTICE. Section 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be closed and open until 5 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer. Every voter present before and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.
