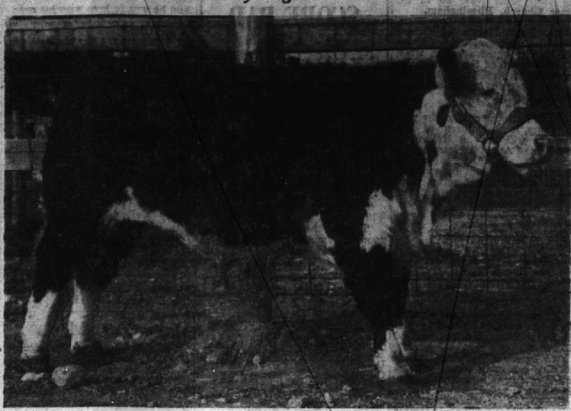

### Community Service Club Hears Address by Arthur P. Bogue

First annual meeting of the Community Service Club was held at the Community House last Wednesday evening. Arthur P. Bogue, president of the Oakland County Bar Association spoke on "Legal Aid." His subject dealt with offering legal aid to persons who are unable to pay an attorney and to give advice and assistance in civil matters and for small madmen.

"The state law provides for services to defend a man accused of felony if he has no funds, but no present plan exists to pay for court or attorney fees, or other legal service that may be needed," Bogue said. "While legal aid has always been given in Oakland County, it has, for many years, been on a voluntary basis for various attorneys."

"At the present time the county bar association has two committees handling legal aid. One serves the southern part of the county, the other the north and each has its own chairman. No fund has been set up to pay those men for the services, however. A legal aid office is needed, and enough work exists to keep one attorney busy, full time. Because of the volume of work the need for a community-sponsored legal aid bureau cannot be questioned." Other speakers include Clarence Cole, president of the club, who spoke briefly on the aims of the group and William Schallberger, chairman of the Legal Aid Branch of Southern Oakland County, he offered comments during the discussion period that followed Bogue's address.

They declined to remove St.

James church property at Cranbrook and Maple from the tax rolls, as requested by the Rev. Harold Towne, pastor.

Stated Mayor Milton F. Mailender, "The Michigan Supreme Court has many times ruled that church property, if not in actual use by a church, is taxable. I don't think this commission has any legal right to comply with Rev. Towne's request."

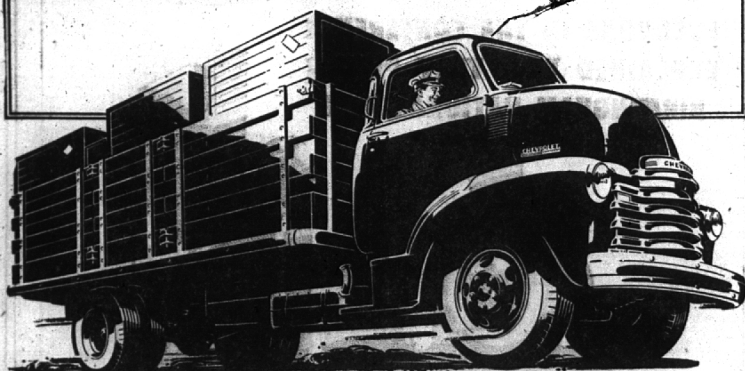
