'49 Summer Road Oiling Local Voters Backs on Primary Ballot

Complete Program Expected to Be Ready by Dec. 15

Residents who wish their street oiled next summer, and who have not already had the city commission create an assessment district for the improvement, were advised this week to get their petitions into the city within the next 30 days.

George A. Dondero and Howard R. Estes, seeking reelection as Congressional representative and state representative, respectively, from this area, greatly outdistanced their rivals in Tuesday's primary vote here, election results from Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills revealed.

In Birmingham, 1,885 voters cast their ballot, while in Bloomfield Hills 199 electors visited the polls. Birmingham gave Dondero 886 votes, Milton F. Cooney 626. Estes gathered 1,258 votes, with only 165 going to Marvin Kuschnicky. In Bloomfield Hills, Dondero got 140 votes to Cooney's 33, Estes 153 to Kuschnicky's 9.
