The opening will be celebrated with the company holding open house and inviting everyone to visit them at their new location. Each guest will be given a gift.

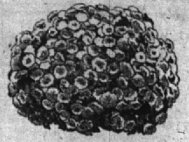
The new location offers large display areas for showing and
