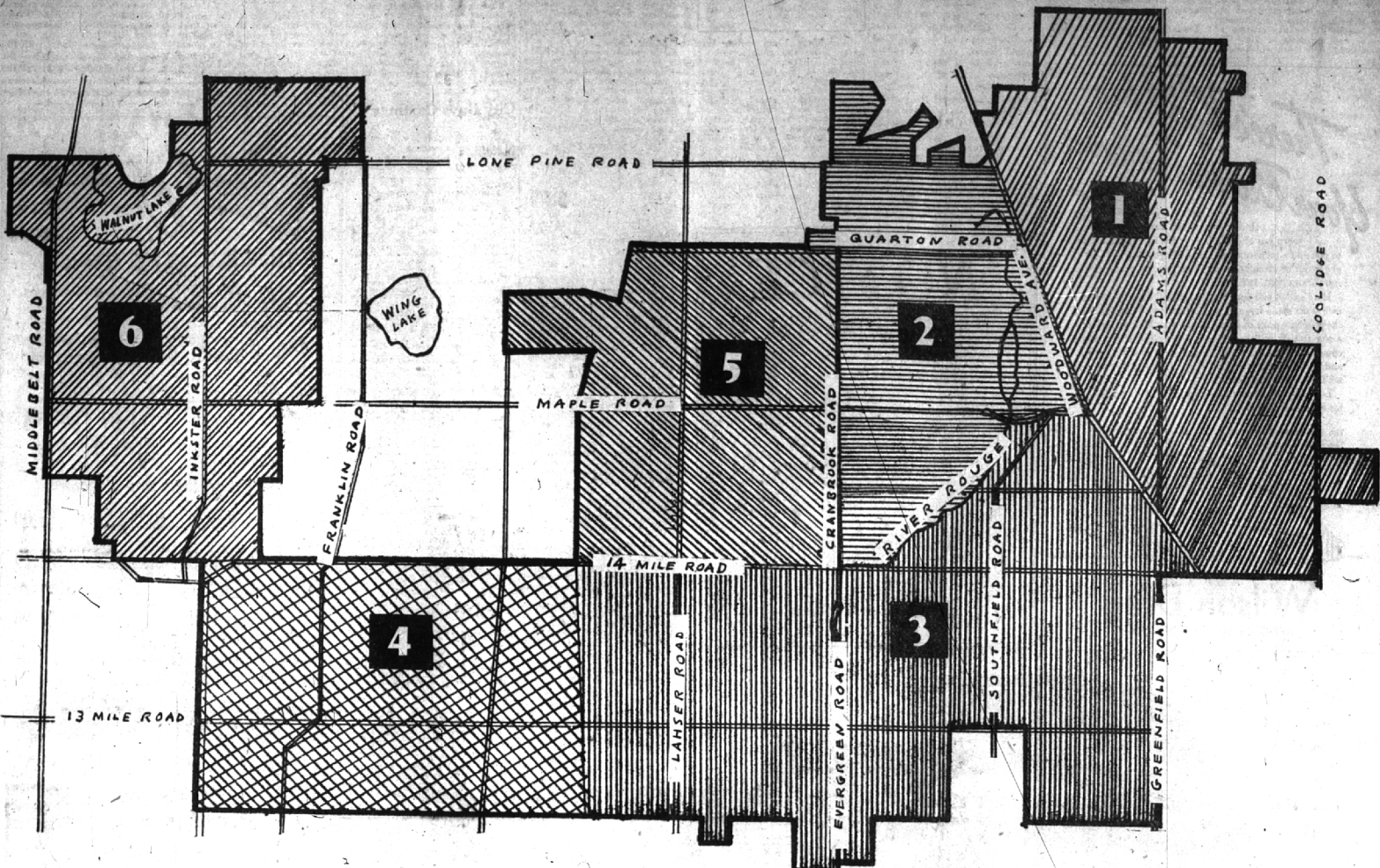


These are Attendance Areas for Birmingham Public Schools



Many inquiries come to the Board of Education daily from parents who are moving into the School District of the City of Birmingham and are anxious to know the school that serves their district. A few modifications have been made in the southern part of the district, particularly in the Beverly Hills area, which parents should know prior to the opening of school. The following attendance areas are so defined that parents can easily determine the school which their child will attend.

SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades 10 through 12 will attend the Baldwin Senior High School, which is located at the corner of Maple and Chester streets.

JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades 7 through 9 will attend Barnum Junior High School, which is located at the corner of Frank and Purdy streets.

ADAMS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, and who reside east of Woodward Avenue, will attend Adams Elementary School—Area 1 on the map.

QUARTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, and who reside west of Woodward, north of River Rouge and Maple, and East of Cranbrook road, will attend Quarton Elementary School—Area 2 on the map. Children on Valley View Lane and Woodland Villa Court may attend Quarton School.

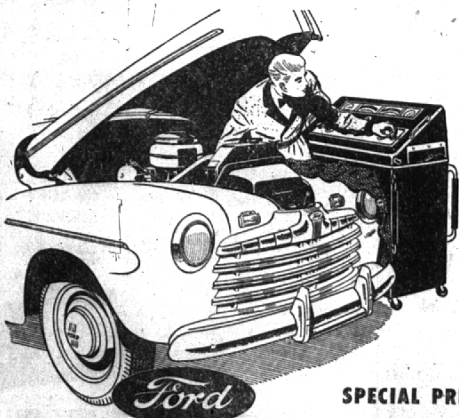
PIERCE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, and who reside south of Maple from Woodward to River Rouge, south of River Rouge from Maple to Fourteen Mile Road, and south of Fourteen Mile Road from River Rouge to a line between Telegraph and Lahser Road, will attend Pierce Elementary School—Area 3 on the map.

FRANKLIN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, and who reside south of Fourteen Mile road, east of Inkster road, west of a line midway between Lahser road and Bingham road, will attend Franklin School, as shown on the map—Area 4.

BLOOMFIELD VILLAGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6, and who reside west of Cranbrook road, and north of Fourteen Mile road, will attend Bloomfield Village Elementary School as shown on the map—Area 5.

WALNUT LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:
All pupils in grades kindergarten through 6 will attend this school from the area as bounded on the map and marked "Area 6."
