University of Michigan Anticipates 20,000 Enrollment for Fall Semester

ANN ARBOR—Enrollment of from 20,000 to 20,500 students is expected at the University of Michigan when the fall semester opens Monday, September 29.

Approximately one-fourth of the anticipated enrollment will be new students, including freshmen, undergraduate transfer students from other colleges, and graduate and professional school students. Registration for all students will begin on Wednesday, Sept. 15, and continue through Saturday morning.

A week's orientation period is planned for the incoming freshmen, beginning Sept. 13.

Fall semester students will find the University offering 87 new courses or degree programs, 77 of the new courses being in the College of Literature, Science and the Arts. The largest number of new offerings will be in the departments of astronomy, economics, mathematics and zoology.

New Grouping of Courses
Students in the College of Engineering will be offered a new grouping of courses which will enable undergraduates to specialize in the construction and contracting fields. A new graduate program in construction engineering is also being provided for students seeking the master's degree.

For graduate students in the public health field, three new programs are planned leading to the doctor's degree in sanitary science, epidemiologic science and health economics. The School Health will also present a course in public health laboratory practice, intended to train medical personnel in the diagnosis of communicable diseases.

New courses will likewise be given to the Law School of Education, and College of Architecture and Design.

Chemistry Bldg. Addition
Four of the five buildings included in the emergency building program authorized by the Legislature in 1946 will be in partial or complete use by the opening weeks of the fall semester. An addition to the East Engineering Building is already in use, while all classrooms and library space in the new School of Business Administration building will be ready this fall. A tower section, in which faculty offices are located, will be ready in the Spring.

An addition to the Chemistry Building is also ready for use, providing badly needed additional laboratory space. The new General Service Building, which will house administration units of the University, is being rushed to completion. Work on the Maternity Hospital is not expected to be completed before 1950.
