

Douglas Reveals GMC Promotions for 3 Local Men

M. D. Douglas, of West Bloomfield Hills, general manager of the GMC Truck & Coach Division of the General Motors, has announced the appointments of John E. Johnson as general truck sales manager and Fred Falberg as factory manager.

Falberg, of 983 Chester street, has been associated with GMC continuously since 1926 and for the last three years has been superintendent of the sheet metal division of GMC. He succeeds Roger J. 16 Years with Chevrolet
Born in Marquette, Mich., Johnson spent his early life as lumberjack in Michigan's upper peninsula. Following his graduation from the Michigan Northern State

Normal School he took up teaching for a short period. In 1923 he joined the Chevrolet organization as a distribution representative in Janesville.

In 16 years with Chevrolet, he held sales posts in many sections of the country and in 1938 was promoted to assistant general sales manager of Chevrolet in charge of the Western half of the United States. In 1929, he became vice-president and director of sales for General Motors of Canada, Ltd., and during the war came back to Detroit to head up General Motors War Products Training Service.

With GMC Since 1926
Falberg was born in Danville, Ill., and has been associated with GMC since 1926 when he started with old Yellow Street Valve Engine Works in Moline, Ill. He was

transferred to Pontiac in 1936 and was promoted to general foreman in the engine division in 1933. In 1937 he became assistant superintendent and in 1938 was made superintendent of the engine division. He became superintendent of the sheet metal division in 1945, the position he has held up to the present.

Little joined General Motors in 1919 as assistant superintendent of the motor and axle plant of Chevrolet in Flint. He served in various executive capacities with Chevrolet until 1939, at which time he was appointed president of the Motor Accounting Division of GM. Two years later he became general truck sales manager of the Yellow Truck and Coach Manufacturing Co., now known as the GMC Truck & Coach Division.
