The maid of honor, Miss Anne Woodruff of Birmingham was dressed in a rust colored dress styled with a V neck, cap sleeves and a fitted bodice.

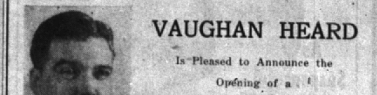

Citizens of the United States, twenty-one years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan, six months and in the City of Bloomfield Hills twenty days at the time of voting are eligible. To register, call at the City Clerk's Office in the Municipal Building between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., except that on Wednesday, October 13, 1948 the Clerk's Office will be open from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

Those who have already registered and who have voted during the last two years do not have to re-register.

The name of no person but an ACTUAL Resident of the City at the time of said registration, and entitled under the Constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration-book.
