

Save Your Child, Teach Him Safety, Moxley Urges

Following Labor Day, about 1,250,000 children in Michigan will be starting to school. Of these, more than 100,000 are beginners who will be confronted with the hazards of traffic for the first time.

Last year, 91 children in Michigan from 5 to 14 years of age were killed as pedestrians or cyclists in motor vehicle accidents. In addition, there were nearly 1,500 pedestrians injured and 850 bicyclists also injured in this age group.

The child traffic accident record is especially bad during the fall months with more children being killed in September than any other month.

Chief of Police Ralph W. Moxley says that "to reduce this needless toll, parents should and are urged to instruct their children in regard to safe walking and bicycling practices and motorists should be especially alert for children and their unpredictable actions."

Moxley pointed out, "Children should be instructed to cross at intersections where there are traffic signals when ever it is possible. They should always stop at the curb and look both ways to make sure it is safe to cross before attempting to do so. They should be taught to walk, not run, when crossing the street and never to step into the roadway from between parked cars. In rural areas, where sidewalks are not available, children should be taught to walk on the left side of the roadway and be alert to step from the path of approaching cars."

Bicyclists should be taught to ride on the right side of the highway to avoid weaving or making sudden turns and to obey stop signs and other traffic regulations, he said.

Moxley urges that motorists at all times considered the child pedestrians and cyclists who are on or along the highway as "human caution signs" and drive with extreme care when near them.
