Living in Berlin Is Uncomfortable, Reporter Writes

BERLIN, Germany—It's uncomfortable living here in Berlin. . . . Our neighbors across the street eat borsch. And any day he may decide to eat his borsch on our side of the street. His dog is bigger than ours and he probably could get away with it. For a short time there was the rub for the Russians, who know full well our war potential, when rallied, is greater. They need time to get ready.

While waiting, our neighbor is being as irritating as possible. In the hopes, no doubt, we will become so annoyed we will go home. Then he could swallow Berlin, take a deep breath, then gulp down all of Europe. Then later would come the day when he would look hungrily across the Atlantic at the United States where the grass not only looks greener, but is.

We Have Some Friends

We have some friends on our side of the street. The British, the French . . . and even the Berliners, (who may not love us but prefer us to the Russians.) are just as determined to stick it out, no matter how much the Russians breath hot on their necks.

The Russians have tried everything: They walk out of 4-power meetings, they refuse free travel into their zone. They would not adopt the same currency, school or land reforms. They spotted their own zone. Then they refused passage of trains bringing all food and vital supplies into Berlin. Today, they are kidnapping "offend-

ers" . . . sometimes this means merely having a camera within spitting distance of the Russian border.

Life Really Tough

This has made life really tough for the 9,000 Americans and our allies living in Berlin. There is no freedom of action as in other parts of Germany, excluding the Eastern Soviet zone. Food is monotonous; out of a can. There is no fresh milk. No green vegetable or fruit unless one has a garden. No ice cream. Americans are not starving, but they are bored with the sameness of the diet . . . and always wonder what would happen if Operation Vittle stopped flying.

Yet no one is suggesting the time has come to be shooed out of Berlin. "We may have to risk war to prevent war" sums up the attitude.
