With the sandwiches serve milk or lemonade, carrot and celery sticks, and ice cream and cake.

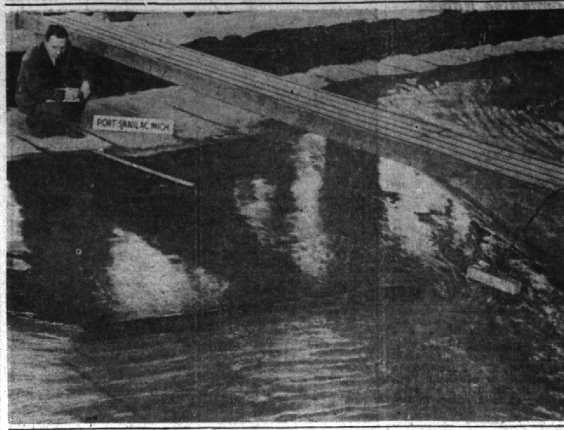

U-M Research Will Help Build 2 Michigan Harbors

This agreement, the first with Bloomfield Hills, is similar to that which Birmingham has had for some time with Bloomfield Village residents.

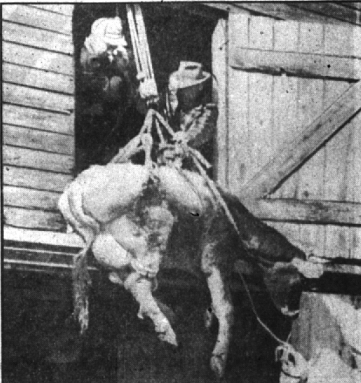

Campaign Continues Against Unsafe Cars on Local Highways

Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills police moved into the third week of the brake and light checking program designed to reduce traffic accidents by correcting unsafe conditions of cars. Chief Ralph W. Moxley and Ima Banks reported that both departments were still finding some vehicles which do not meet all the requirements for complete highway safety.

In Birmingham there were 15 cars found with unsafe brakes, 20 with one headlight out, one with both lights out and 23 vehicles without tail lights.

The Bloomfield Hills officers found 17 with defective brakes, one with defective head lights and one with defective tail lights.

Moxley and Banks are asking all local motorists to help in the efforts of their departments to cut traffic accidents.

"During the first four months of 1949 there has been an increase of 27 per cent in traffic fatalities throughout the state," they reported. "If this increase continues there will be over 400 persons killed on Michigan highways during the year."

Says Partially Built Home Is Hazard to Youngsters

Richard D. Young, 348 Wallace, has called the city's attention to a partly constructed home on Golfview Blvd. which he feels is a hazard to neighborhood children.

"This excavation has been left open for nearly a year now, and at times I have seen 4 to 5 feet of water in it," he wrote the city commission. "It would be very easy for a small youngster to fall into this place and drown." Commissioners said the city would contact the owners to see if the matter can be solved.
