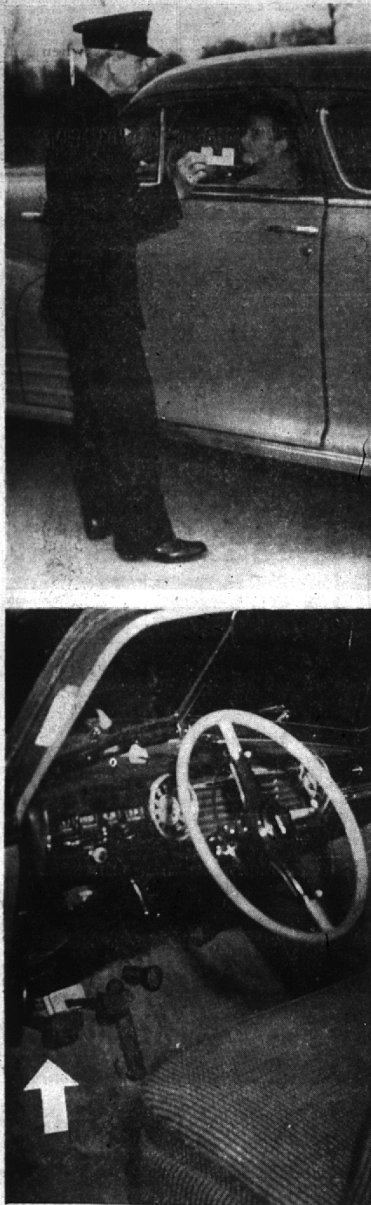


Checks on Progress of Safety Campaign



(TOP) When Mrs. Elizabeth McCann, wife of a Birmingham police officer, stopped to ask Sgt. Delyle Service how the department's campaign was progressing against defective auto brakes and lights, he showed her the "brake block" which is used in the brake test.

(Bottom) White arrow indicates how the block is placed over the brake pedal at the floorboard. If the brakes take hold before the pedal touches the block, the car passes inspection. Any motorist stopped for a traffic violation during April and May will have his car given the brake and light test.

Several Subjects Treated in Newest Cranbrook Exhibits

New exhibits now open at the museum of the Cranbrook Academy of Art are "40 Drawings from the Collection of the Museum of Modern Art," fabrics by the Latin Americans, Meza, Lavernes, Jewelry by Quentin R. Neal and "Progress of a Mural" by Clifford B. West.

The exhibit of 40 drawings is introduced by the work of European artists. This show of 20th century drawings includes work by the Latin Americans, Meza, Orozco, Portinari and Rivera, followed by a section of American drawings. Bacon, Blume, Hart, K. A. Foil, Kuniyoshi, O'Keefe, Sheeler and other well-known American artists are represented in this group. Sculptors' drawings, studies by Gaudier-Brzeska, Lavernes, Moore and Rodin, are included in this collection.

From their Greenvale, Long Island, studio, Estelle and Erving Laverne are interpreting beauty suitable to their own times. Freshness, freedom and spontaneity pervade and identify the Lavernes designs. This husband-and-wife team are proving that in having to convictions that are worthwhile, responses will follow. "Fun to Run" which was first shown at the Metropolitan Museum of Art is included in this exhibition of their textiles.

Quentin R. Neal, Chicago painter and metalworker, will exhibit his contemporary silver jewelry

which is distinguished by piercing and applique.

Original sketches, large cartoons, actual materials and equipment as well as a photo sequence, trace the progress of Clifford B. West's mural decoration at the Detroit City Bank Room of the Penobscot Building. The intention of this exhibition is to illustrate the development of this project which had Michigan for the theme. Mr. West is the painting instructor at Kingswood School Cranbrook.

These exhibits will continue to May 8. Museum hours are from two to five daily except Mondays.
