**To Preside at Talk by State Dept. Official**

Allan B. Lutz, 667 Greenwood avenue, will preside at a "Foreign Policy Round-Up" to be co-sponsored by the Foreign Policy Association and the Detroit Public Library on Friday, April 22, at 8 p. m. at the Main Library, Woodward and Kirby Avenues, Detroit.

Robert Mills McClintock, acting deputy director of the Office of United Nations Affairs, Department of State, will be the speaker. In his talk he will emphasize the newest arm of the United Nations, the International Trade Organization, which will shortly be brought to Congress for ratification.

Following his graduation from Leland Stanford University in 1931, McClintock served as a foreign service officer in Panama City, Panama; Kobe, Japan; Santiago, Chile; Ciudad Trujillo, Dominican Republic; Helsinki, Finland; and Stockholm, Sweden.

**At Special Session**  
He served on the International Secretariat at the San Francisco Conference in 1945 and as adviser to the U. S. delegation to the Preparatory Commission of the United Nations in London in the same year. More recently he was assigned to attend the special session on Palestine in the same capacity.

The meeting, which will be held in the north wing of the library, will be open to the public without charge. Lutz will act as chairman in the absence of Mrs. Charles J. Shain, of Birmingham, Foreign Policy Association president, who is attending the Chicago Council of International Relations meetings at which Arnold Toynbee, who formerly taught Mrs. Shain history, will be one of the principal speakers.

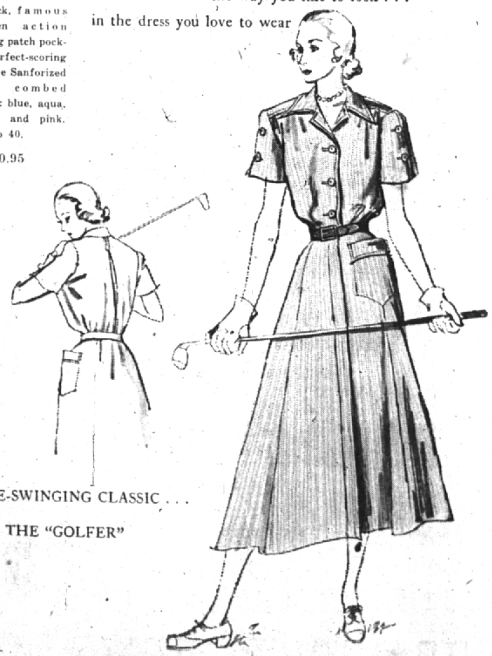
