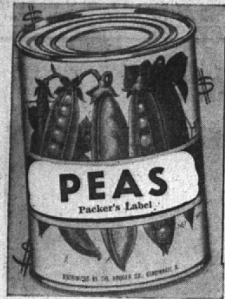

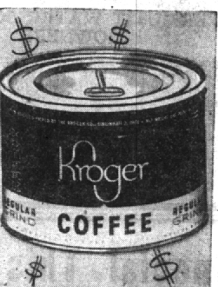

Attend Red Cross Meeting Held at Cranbrook Church

At the American Red Cross dinner meeting held last week Wednesday night at Cranbrook church 75 committee members of Oakland county board of Harvey Johns, chairman of the disaster service industrial section, speak on the achievement record attained during the past months.

He said that the county has been split in four distinct units to provide better protection, in case one or more sections were suddenly stricken with fire, flood or other disasters.

"The housing and food situation has adequate facilities to care for victims through completed arrangements made by the committees. They have contacted American Legion posts, sportsmen's clubs and various hotels and restaurants and knowledge of the number of persons each could shelter and feed, is on record," he stated.

A mobile unit was demonstrated on the church grounds so spectators might witness the efficiency under which they operate through two-way short wave radio and walkie-talkie systems. This method of communication has been under severe tests in past months, and proven effective in alerting all units on existing conditions following disaster. Portable units are dispatched to stricken areas as needed, he pointed out.

Glenn Griffin reported the success of the Red Cross fund drive. He told the audience that the chapter had raised \$107,009 and that many cities and counties had nearly doubled their quota. Harvey Johns appointed his sub-chairman, naming Harry L. Coib of Pontiac, chairman of northern Oakland county and Charles Henry, director of Boys Republic, for the south.
