

Missionary Plans Easter Treat for Children

Bernard Fowler, acting postmaster here, received a letter from the Rev. H. G. C. Hallock, Ph. D., recently, addressed to the people of Birmingham. The letter is apparently in answer to the general help which has gone to China from this vicinity. It reads: "480 Chapop Road, March 7, 1949. "Dear Friends: "Last September I meant to write to you about the Christmas treat I wished to give my 1,000 ragged Sunday School children, but unfortunately I became ill all of a sudden and so I could not write, to my great sorrow. Now I am a little better I wish to let you know my little ones had a good time last Christmas. "We are planning to have an Easter treat, God willing, this Easter, and wish to give all the little ones candy and Easter eggs. We have a great time every Easter telling the story of our Saviour's Resurrection. My little Brovins and I wish you a very happy Easter. "Send us missionaries—lots of them. Do pray for us at this time, especially because we have many problems and difficulties to face. "Pray for the children that they may escape the troubles and have a joyful Easter. Pray that the Lord will spare me another 16 years of service for Him in China. Yours in Christ's glad service, "Rev. H. G. C. Hallock."

Postage carried on the envelope is for 200 years. Rev. Hallock also enclosed a 1,000 yen note, issued by the Military Government of China for use by the people. One group of characters on the bill refer to "Rice, the Land of Plenty," which is the Chinese reference to this country.
