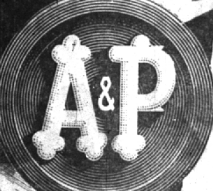
Have you ever noticed the date stamped on each carton of A&P eggs? It is put there to protect the quality and freshness of this perishable item.
