

**Yes, There's a Weed Ordinance, But City Can't Make It Work**

For the second time this summer, the city is going over all vacant property between the street and one foot inside the sidewalk to cut down weeds. City Manager Donald C. Egbert stated at Monday night's city commission meeting.

"We are in the second phase of the current program," Egbert said in response to a question from a resident on Hamilton street, who complained of too many weeds on lots near her home.

Egbert said the city in 1929 passed an ordinance calling for each property owner to cut the weeds down on his particular property, but the city hadn't been able to make the ordinance work.

"We have tried it many times in the past, but the city can't seem to collect from these lot owners, many of whom live out of town or even out of the state," the manager stated. "About all we can do is keep the city's share cut down."
