Special ratings are given those who successfully pass the tests and there's some stiff competition around as they struggle to become a "mate" or "skipper".

The sailing season at Camp Nissokone was off to a big start when the campers arrived late in June. The camp's fleet of four snipes are newly equipped with mylonic sails. The boats are decked with green canvas contrasted against the white hulls.

Along with these accomplishments came the rating of "mate". The rating of "skipper" obtained by but few campers is awarded to those campers who can successfully "solo". For the skippers, sailing races are held every Sunday afternoon.
