

**Localities Aboard Aircraft Carrier**

PENSACOLA, FLA., AUGUST 14.—Pilots and crewmen of Air Group 59 from Grosse Ile Naval Air Station are enroute in the Gulf of Mexico aboard the aircraft carrier, USS Cabot as they bring to a conclusion two weeks of annual training.

Included in the group from this area are Lt. Commander James M. Mason, Jr., of Kennesaw road and Arthur J. Lake, airman apprentice of Oakland avenue.

Fifty-three pilots, all from Michigan, have requalified in carrier operations on a schedule that runs from 7:00 a.m. until evening. Along with the pilots, crewmen have once again found their sea legs as they turn to on the variety of tasks required to operate a carrier air group at sea.

The group will return to Grosse Ile on August 21 and will be at their civilian jobs again on Monday. They will continue to report to Grosse Ile one weekend a month throughout the year to maintain the proficiency developed on this cruise to southern waters.
