

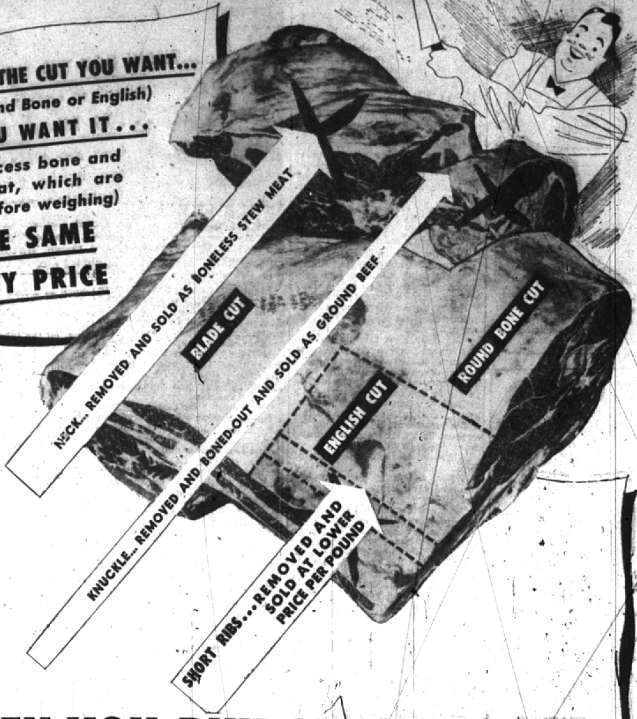

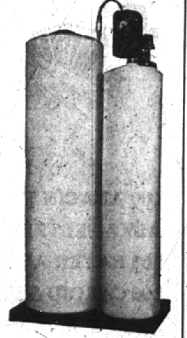
Plans and estimate of cost of this project are filed with the City Clerk of the City of Birmingham for examination by the public.
