

### Cadet Milliman With Navy for Amphibious Training in South

Second Class Cadet Dwight William Milliman, Jr., 1260 Yorkshire road, is among the West Point cadets receiving amphibious training with the Naval Reserve. The 880 cadets and midshipmen will train from Aug. 8 through Aug. 22 with the amphibious forces of the Atlantic Fleet under the direction of Rear Admiral Gerald Wright, U.S.N.

The shore training will be at the Little Creek, Va., base and will be completed Aug. 18. Beginning tomorrow the men will receive their training aboard the ships which make up the Atlantic Fleet.

The cadets and midshipmen will train with seasoned combat veterans, who will instruct them in establishing a beachhead and give information on assault tactics.

Cadet Milliman will take part in

the bombardment of Bloodworth Island in Upper Chesapeake Bay, which will include live fire from ships and Air Force jets. Navy fighters and bombers, following the final assault landing at Camp Pendleton, Va., the cadets will leave for Fort Eustace and Fort Story for further training.
