Schermerhorn-Bunyan Rites Are Read in Baptist Church

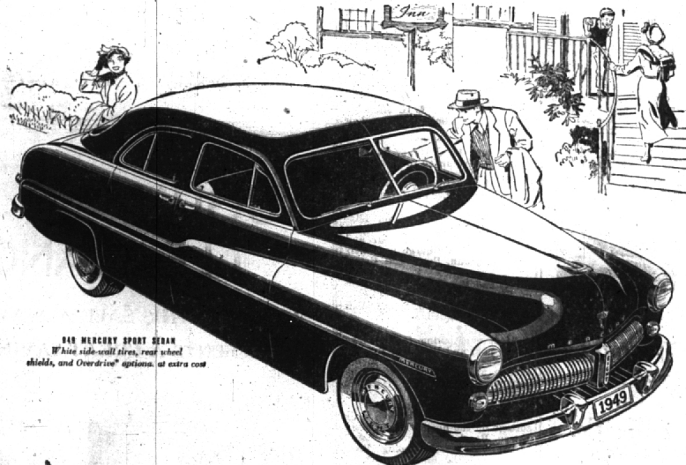
