## National Guard Training Praised By Military and Civilian Officials

CAMP GRAYLING—Michigan National Guard troops returned to their home communities Saturday, completing two weeks of summer training which won them commendation from both military and civilian officials.

Top-ranking army inspectors expressed surprise at the progress of Michigan Guardsmen during the 1949 encampment and praised recent improvements in training facilities at the state military reservation.

After witnessing a review of Michigan troops and their motorized equipment, Governor Williams complimented Guardsmen "for a job well done."

During his day-long inspection of the camp, the governor said he was "particularly impressed by the evident pride that the officers and men took in their several duties. With such spirit I know they will not only get intense satisfaction from doing a good job but will serve the state of Michigan and the United States well."

Guardsmen were to dress their two weeks of active duty military pay Thursday and Friday before breaking camp for the trip home. Total pay roll, including the allow-

ance for airmen who completed their summer training, schedules two weeks ago is estimated at \$940,000.

Special troop trains moved out of Grayling Friday night carrying units making the trip home by rail, while motor convoys will leave Saturday morning with the remainder.

During their stay in camp some 7,800 Guardsmen absorbed additional small arms and heavy artillery weapons practice, learned about speedy movement of an infantry division into combat zones by air, bivouacked overnight in the wooded areas of camp away from the main garrison and put into use for the first time the state military reservation's new armored training center.

At a Sunday morning memorial service honoring Michigan Guardsmen killed in past wars Governor Williams said, "You are demonstrating to all the world your faith in our way of life and your determination to defend it against all enemies. You are an object lesson in democracy under arms which our enemies cannot fail to understand. You are keeping faith with the heroes of yesterday and with generations yet unborn."
