C. J. Collom Plans to Rebuild Burned Wetrionic Factory

SOUTHFIELD—C. J. Collom, owner of the Wetrionic plant which was totally destroyed by fire last week said Monday that he would start construction of a new plant as soon as final details on insurance were cleared.

The plant, located at 15700 West Eight Mile, was 60 x 250 feet. Fire of undetermined origin broke out in an assembly room about 4 a.m., gutting the entire building. Several explosions added to the havoc. The blaze also destroyed automobiles and trucks.

Joseph Jackson of Hamtramck, plant watchman, told Chief A. W. Kruck, head of the Southfield township fire department, that he tried to extinguish the flames himself. Four fire companies later responded to the call.

Some records and files, kept in the front office, were saved, according to W. C. Lamb, purchasing agent, but all sales records were lost.

The destroyed structure was a steel frame and concrete block building with a wood roof. Collom estimated his loss at \$250,000, which he said was covered by insurance.

Wetrionic was engaged in the manufacture of electrical control equipment.
