**The SCORE PAD**

(Sense and insurance at the bridge table. Other patiences.)

A few minutes before the game started Mac McElhenny, the tournament director, tapped me on the shoulder. "Suppose you were defending a three no-trump contract, and in spades you held only the king and the eight spot, and the declarer finessed the spade jack up to you—what card would you play?" "The king, naturally." "My partner played the eight spot." "Come, come, Mac. Nobody would do a thing like that. Who was your partner?" "C. W. Churchill." "Now I know you're kidding." "Lay those cards out, and I'll show you what happened." I laid out the cards, as follows:

North (Dealer)  
S-Q 5 2  
H-Q 8 7 2  
D-K 8 6 4  
C-2  
West South  
S-7 6 S-A 10 9 8 3  
H-K 10 9 5 4  
D-A 9 5 D-10  
C-Q 10 9 8 3 C-J  
Declarer (Church)  
S-K 8  
H-6 3  
D-K 7 2 2  
C-A K 7 6 5

"Of course I wouldn't give the opponents any prizes for their bidding," went on Mac. "East should never have permitted West to play three no-trump. But he did. And I opened the heart door, and let West take the trick with his ace, and led a low spade toward dummy. I played the deuce. Dummy's jack was finessed—and Church played the eight!" "What in the world for?" "You'll see in a minute. Dummy held the trick. The next lead was the club jack. Church grabbed that trick with his king, and led the spade king!" "Something clicked in my brain. Now I get it. Magnificent! Dummy's spade ace makes but you still held the queen. And the entire dummy was a dead duck from that point on. Declarer could never get out of his hand!" "Right. We took a cold top on the board." "Who but Church would make such a play as that?" "Who?"

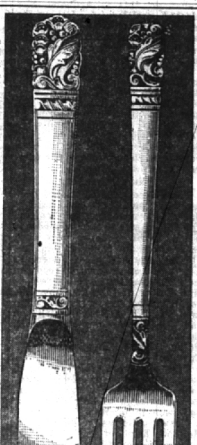

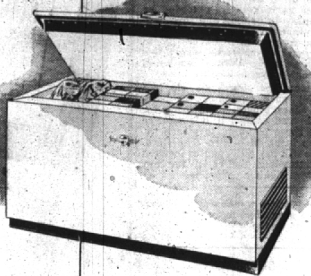
