Birmingham residents are being offered an opportunity to cooperate with the Charles Edwards Post 14 of the American Legion and the Auxiliary in remembering every sick or disabled war veteran in Michigan at Christmas time this year.

There are 70 hospitals in the state now caring for these 7,000 veterans, for whom the war has not ended. It is proposed to give each of them a Christmas gift box, for that's the least we can do. The slogan is "Gifts for the Yanks who Gave" and the project is being sponsored for the sixth successive year by the Legion. It is nation-wide in scope and constitutes the biggest Christmas party on record.

A spokesman for the Legion and Auxiliary said, "It's a real task to purchase the gifts and pack,

wrap and deliver the boxes to the veterans and we, the sponsors, need the cooperation of all generous citizens. The value of each box will range from four to five dollars and the public may contribute either cash or gifts."

A collection center has been set up at Mulholland where donations will be received from today, Dec. 1 through the 7th. Suggested gifts include: pen and pencil sets, cigarettes, cigarette cases, writing kits, pipes, leather belts, watch straps, bedspreads, tie pin sets, books, tennis balls, key cases, and any other items either useful or entertaining. No foodstuffs can be placed in the packages.

This is Birmingham's chance to go over the top in a show of appreciation just as those veterans went "over the top" with a display of the utmost in courage
