

Residents Are Advised to Be Careful While Ice Skating at Quorton Lake

Ice skating facilities will again be made available to Birmingham residents by the City Recreation Board this winter, Frank Whitney, recreation director, said this week. "While the Recreation Department will assume no responsibility or liability for any of the activities occurring on Quorton Lake, it will take all steps to make the skating area as safe as it is humanly possible, he said. This will include sections which will be cabled off for segregating events; a direct telephone line will

be centrally located for emergency calls; a new ice rescue board will be available for immediate use; and the surface of the lake will be kept free of deep snow. Night skating will be made available. "As no direct supervision will be furnished, parents are asked to accompany small children and confine their activities to the safe areas of the lake," Whitney said. "At no time can the ice which is adjacent to the dam or directly over the main channel be con-

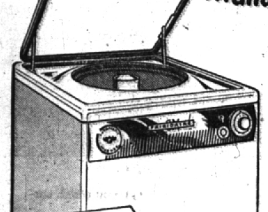
