The drawing of names for the Christmas party took place Friday afternoon.

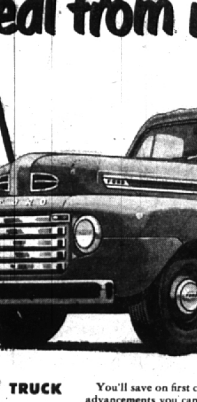
