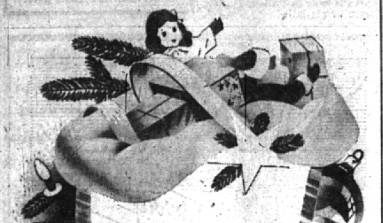

The Southfield township school board has engaged the services of a Birmingham engineer-contractor who will drive a four-inch test well on the new high school site at 10 Mile near Lahser road. The well will provide water for the construction of the school.

The board of education is working with Dudley P. Frame, town supervisor, to try to secure city water for the school. Archie Leonard, attorney for the school board, has been authorized to determine the feasibility of such a plan from the legal angle.

The board is progressing favorably according to Glenn Schabala, board of education supervisor.

Off-street parking in commercial areas of Southfield Township is under consideration of the board of commissioners. Effective action will demand amending zoning ordinance 118, according to the township clerk, Mrs. Fannie Adams.

The township plans to join other municipalities in Southern Oakland county in an engineering survey to determine the feasibility of creating a metropolitan water authority and share in the cost. The authority would provide "feeder" mains where necessary.
