Hi-Y Clubs Take Charge of State for Two-Day Race

A group of 400 high school boys from Hi-Y clubs in Michigan will elect their own governor, lieutenant governor, other state officers, members of the House and Senate and alternates at the Michigan Hi-Y Legislature tomorrow and Saturday in East Lansing.

Actual rules and regulations will govern the conduct of the assembled body as they meet in committee and legislative sessions, to enact laws and follow through on the jobs of their community and state leaders.
