## BHHS Student Relates Some of His Experiences as a Japanese Slave Laborer

Robert Yukawa, American Japanese boy who is a student at Bloomfield Hills High School, was one of the many school boys taken from their lessons by the Japanese and forced to work for the army. His assignment was in a munitions plant.

Robert, the son of a Buddhist missionary, was born in Tacoma, Wash., while his father was doing missionary work in this country. The family returned to Japan for a visit shortly before the outbreak of the war and were unable to return to this country for several years. Robert is at present staying at the Devon Gables Inn where he is doing part-time work while continuing his studies.

Yukawa's story, as it was printed in the Blue and White BHHS paper reads:

"On April 18, 1945, our grade was drafted to work in a factory. The one I was sent to made gun powder and other explosives. I cannot forget the first sight of the factory.

"There were several chimneys, and from them came different colored smoke. From one, yellow, from others brown, orange, purple and red. It looked very pretty until I stepped inside. I couldn't breathe because of the smell. Some of the gases hurt my nose, some made me almost faint and others nearly made me sick at my stomach.

"The next thing I noticed was the water. Everywhere were ponds to be used in case of an emergency. The color of the water was yellow, brown or red.

"We all looked at this and complained to each other about the factory. We were then taken to our dressing room. This was an army factory so an officer came in to greet us, or rather, came in to look at his new slaves. He gave each of us a cap, coat, pants and rubber shoes. These were our working clothes, but when we lined up in them we looked like a bunch of prisoners. Some had too big clothes, some too small. The army thought we were supposed to make our bodies fit the sizes of the clothes and not to make the clothes fit our bodies.

"After we were dressed up, the officer gave us information about the work we were going to do. First he said, 'If we put you into the factory right away you will die because of the chemical substance. So, until you get used to these things we will let you carry
