

Birmingham Prepares For First League Meet Here

For the first time in history, a league meet in a major sport will be held here when the Eastern Michigan swim teams convene at Barnum pool next Wednesday to determine the league championship, with preliminaries at 3:30 and finals at 1:30 p. m.

The Maple aggregation is a strong contender to cap the league crown from Mt. Clemens, last year's champ. Birmingham has defeated the Bathers in a dual meet 48-33 but they are a strong team with two returning league champions.

Captain Joe Reinhold and Jack Krause are the returning champs with Reinhold holding the league record of 2:07.75 in the 150 yard individual medley, and Krause the 200 yard free style at 2:37.2.

Mt. Clemens also rest hopeful for first place honors on team balance, which is more likely to show up in a large meet than in a dual.
