Library Board Tells Problems Growth Brings
"Must Baldwin Library curtail some service or cut it by more funds to provide for its constantly growing business? This is the problem which the Library Board faces," stated Mrs. John Lambie, president, following last Thursday night's board meeting. "So grave is the present situation, that the board has decided the public must be acquainted with the facts, and its help enlisted in solving the problem."
It was brought out that during the past six years the volume of business has increased over 25 per cent, with from \$1,000 to 110,000 books circulated annually in spite of this the number of staff members remains the same. According to standards of the American Library Association and local experience an additional staff member is urgently needed. Soaring maintenance costs of an overzealous and aging plant deplete the budget and leave no funds to increase a staff too small to handle the rapidly growing business.

Limited by Charter
"Library support," Mrs. Lambie said, "is derived almost entirely from that portion of city taxes known as the Library Fund," limited by city charter to one mill on the dollar of assessed valuation. It is augmented in small part, by overdue fines and fees from out-of-town borrowers.
"Until additional sources of revenue can be found to cope with the problem, the necessity for curtailing hours of service is a serious threat, especially acute in a rapidly expanding community already looking to the library for increased and more varied services."
Citizens and organizations will be asked to meet with Miss Joanne Lloyd, librarian, to study the problem and work toward its solution," Mrs. Lambie concluded.

In the third quarter, Coach Jack Simonds cleared the bench and saw his charges drive to a 34 to 23 third quarter lead and finish in front with much to spare. It was by far the best exhibition of basketball the local 'Y' group has displayed this year. Birmingham opposes Fisher on their floor this evening.

Peace Through World Government To Be UWF Meeting Topic

UWF is an international, non-partisan group which believes that lasting peace can be obtained only through world government.
Ralph Barnes, executive director of the Michigan group will act as moderator. He has long been a worker in the cause of world government as the means to this lasting peace. He will discuss the work of the group, explain their statement of belief and show how they aim to make an ideal peace through world government a reality.
United World Federalists were founded by Cord Meyer, Jr., former captain in the Marine Corps, and associate of Harold Stassen during the peace conference at San Francisco, about four years ago. There are already several hundred thousand members in the group.
It is hoped that a Birmingham group may be formed and interested persons may attend the Saturday meeting.
Will Correct Error In Bates Assessment
Bates street property owners, north of Wilcox, have already paid their equitable share of the new sewer, recently installed there, City Manager Donald C. Eckert believes.
Accordingly, the city commission Monday night recalled the assessment roll to correct this error, caused by a reassessment of costs.
