Chest X-rays to Be Given At Municipal Building Mar. 8-11

The Birmingham health department, cooperating with the Oakland Tuberculosis Association, will have the mobile x-ray unit of the Michigan Health Department available to local residents for four days beginning March 8.

The unit will be set up in the foyer of the Municipal building where free x-rays will be given food handlers, industrial workers and the general public.

Local persons may report for these free x-rays on March 8 from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m.; March 9 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; March 10 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; and March 11 from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m. Health department workers said it is not necessary to disrobe for the x-rays, and that the process takes but a few moments of one's time. In normal cases, a card will be sent to the person, while in abnormal cases the x-ray, with interpretation, will be sent to the family doctor.
