Gov. G. Mennen Williams will be the guest speaker at the luncheon and has chosen as his topic "State Taxes". The Tax Institute is being held in connection with the special study being made by the League of state fiscal problems.

Mrs. James Dunn of Walled Lake, who is state taxation chairman, is in charge of the program which will consist of a series of panels on various phases of these problems. The Birmingham League will participate in the morning panel on "Standards for Distribution to Local Government."

Chalmers Smith is chairman of the meeting and members of her international affairs committee will raise the following questions: should we join Canada and the Brussels Pact countries in pledging military defenses? Would such a step bring another war closer by widening the East-West split? Would such an act on the part of the United States help or harm the power and progress of the United Nations?

Mrs. F. G. Garrison will talk on the Rio Pact; Mrs. Allan Lutz on the Brussels Pact and Mrs. Phillip Pretz on the North Atlantic Defense Pact.

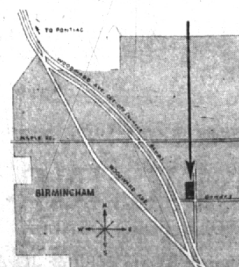
