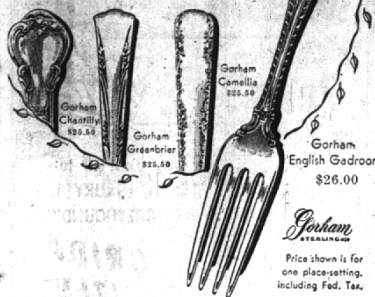

Completes Overseas Duty of 23 Months

Fifth Air Force, Iami Japan—Master Sergeant John W. Thomas, formerly of Birmingham and son of Mr. M. Thomas of Bullywood, Calif., has completed 23 months overseas service with the Fifth Air Force. He was assigned to duty with the 38th Bombardment Wing, Iami, Japan, where Sergeant Thomas is currently stationed. He was with the 38th Installation Squadron as an administrative specialist.

Sergeant Thomas first entered the military service at Detroit on October 1, 1939 and served in the European Theater of Operations from January 1941 to April 1945. Returning to the United States he was discharged at Detroit, on June 19, 1946. Reenlisting shortly after his discharge, he was alerted for movement to the Pacific Theater of Operations in January 1947.

Arriving in Japan at the second major port, Yokohama, in February, 1947, Sergeant Thomas was assigned to the Fifth Air Force and subsequently reassigned to the 38th Installation Squadron at Iami Air Force Base on the main Japanese home island of Honshu.
