In addition to the musical program, the Vesper Service will consist of evening prayer and meditation.

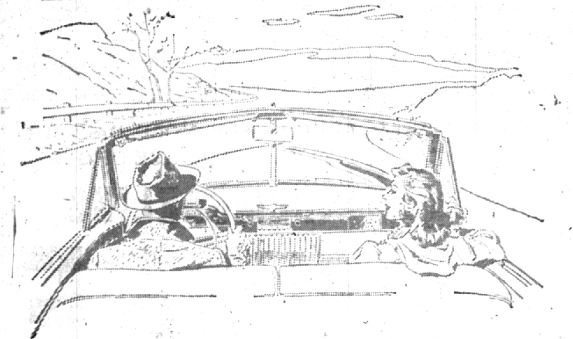

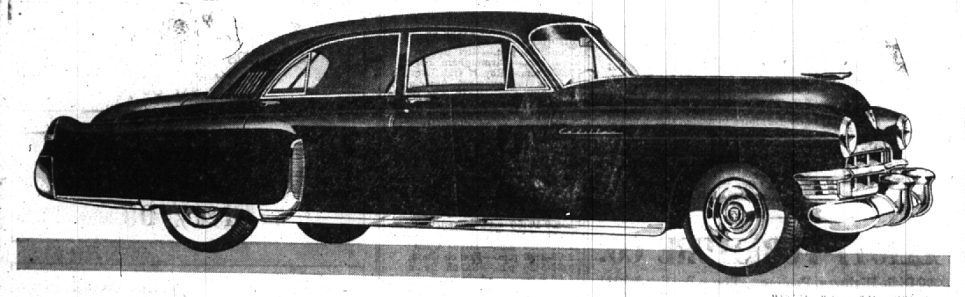

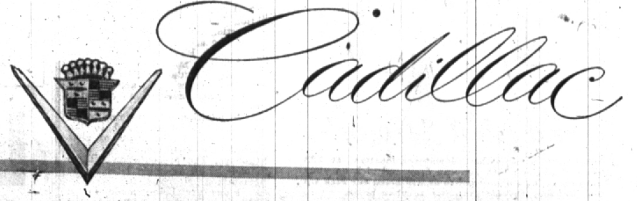
