Democracy in Greece Topic of Dr. Homer Davis

Dr. Homer W. Davis, president of Athens College, who is in the United States for a three month visit from Greece, will speak on "Chances for Democracy for Greece" this Friday, Jan. 28 at 9:00 p.m. in the public library. He is being presented by the League of Women Voters as a community service and his talk is without charge and open to the public.

Since 1916, when he graduated from Hamilton College, Dr. Davis has spent most of his life in the Near East, chiefly in Greece. After four years of teaching in Robert College and the American College for Girls in Istanbul, Turkey, he went to Greece in 1925 to help organize Athens College. Shortly afterwards, he became its second president.

With Consulate
Dr. Davis was compelled to leave in 1941 when Greece was invaded. During the war years he worked for the welfare of the Greek people. He was with the Board of Economic Warfare as chief of the project licensing division immediately after returning to the U. S. In the spring of 1942, he became executive vice-president of the Greek War Relief and the following year was appointed as special assistant to the Foreign Service Auxiliary of the State Department assigned to the American Consulate in Istanbul. He went to Greece as public relations officer for the UNRRA in 1942. In 1946, he returned to the college at Athens.

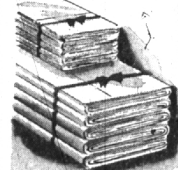
