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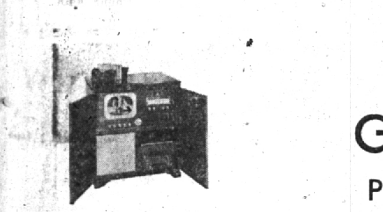
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Spring today—Winter tomorrow. Last Tuesday evening the 18th was good weather for ducks. However, a few came down to the 19-30 Club.
