

### Laymen of Detroit District are Hosts at Church Dinner

Last week laymen of the Detroit District of the Methodist Church pioneered what was the first meeting of its kind in Methodism. Church area leaders believe that the gathering will offer a pattern for the total church in its program of ministerial recruitment. At a 7 o'clock dinner 56 laymen were hosts to 50 young men who are considering the ministry or some other form of Christian service.

Jack Maynard of First Church Birmingham, chairman of the district recruitment committee, acted as master of ceremonies. The invocation was given by the Rev. Arnold Runkel, minister of First Church.

"A Layman's Evaluation of His Ministry" was given by Leroy B. McInally, a Detroit attorney and layman at St. Mark's Church. Maynard read excerpts of the Episcopal address delivered at the General Conference of the Church at Boston last May, calling attention of the church to the fact that Methodism needs a minimum of 875 newly ordained ministers each year to meet the bare requirements of replacement.

Dr. Henry Hill Crane of Central Methodist church, Detroit, delivered the address of the evening, "Why I Entered the Ministry."
