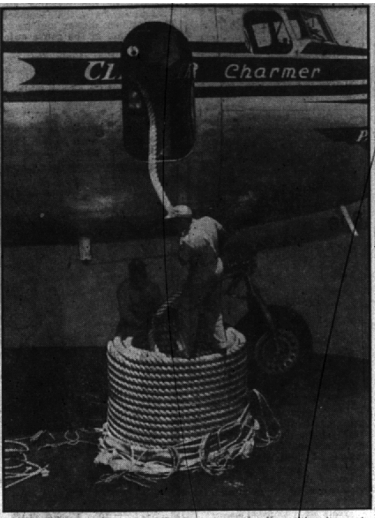

Ann Penrose Is Drowned While At Nantucket Camp

Ann Penrose, 8, of 310 Washington road was drowned last Thursday in Nantucket Harbor, Mass.

It was her first day at Siasconet summer camp, a day nursery camp located on Nantucket island. Ann was one of nine girls who went with counselors for a picnic at Pocumot point—a beach near the camp.

The girls were allowed to wading when they reached the picnic grounds. Two of the girls ventured to deep water and were trapped in the outgoing current. They were rescued by the counselors. It was then that Ann was found to be missing.

The local police were immediately summoned. It was not established at that time whether or not Ann had been swept to sea.

Helicopters and boats were dispatched to search for the missing girl. They recovered the body from the sea off Nantucket harbor.

Funeral services were held last Saturday afternoon at the Siasconet chapel. Details on the burial were not immediately available here.

Among the survivors are the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clement A. Penrose, Jr. a brother and a sister, Clement A., and Virginia, and her grandparents, Dr. and Mrs. H. H. Hills.
