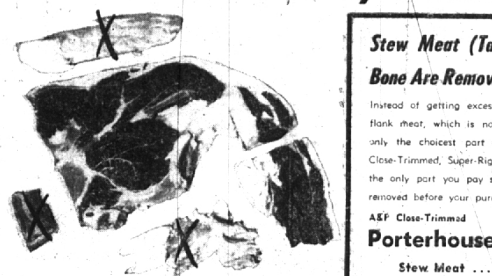


Short Ribs and Excess Chine Bone Are Removed Before Weighing

Short ribs of beef are delicious broiled, but they're not as tender as the rest of the ribs and should not be roasted along with them. Furthermore, they contain more bones, so they should obviously cost less per pound than rib roast. That's why A&P removes the short ribs (along with the 2 heavy blade ribs and the tip of the chine bone) before weighing your roast, and sells them separately. The only part of a rib of beef you pay for is the tender, juicy heart of the roast.

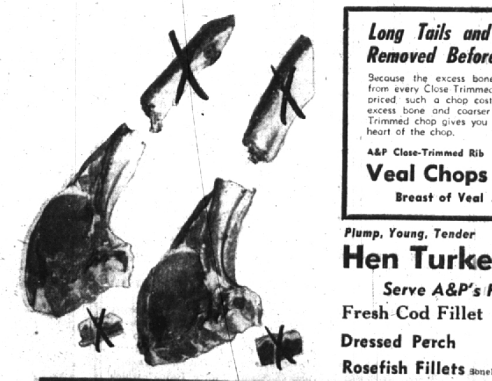


Stew Meat (Tail) Excess Fat and Bone Are Removed Before Weighing
