## The SCORE PAD

(Score and notes at the bridge table after each session.)

"Nice going, partner."  
"Thank you. I looked rugged for a while. Of course, with Carl lucky for me that East continued spaces instead of shifting to a heart at trick two."  
"And West's double helped."  
"It sure did. That was the clue to the squeeze. Nobody could accuse us of being bunnies when it came to hiding, either."

The board:  
North  
S-10 3 2  
H-8  
D-A Q 8 6 3  
C-Q J 8 8  
West  
S-K J 9 6 5 S-Q 7 4  
H-K Q 7 H-10 6 5 4 2  
D-K 4 2 D-None  
C-6 C-10 9 4 3 2

The auction: South, one no-trump; West, two spades; North, three diamonds; South, four diamonds; North, five clubs; South, six no-trumps; West, double.  
West opened the up-suit, six dummy ducked, and East's queen was allowed to hold the trick. East led the spade suit which fell to South's ace. At this point South's only remaining spade was the ten spot in dummy.  
South then proceeded to bombard West with repeated finesse in the diamond suit, until West's king finally but reluctantly dropped.

South now transferred his attention to the clubs and ran three tricks in this suit ending in dummy. The cards then lay as follows:

South led the club queen and West was on the spot—a spade discard would establish dummy's ten spot; a heart discard would establish South's jack. Lugubriously, he dropped the heart queen.
