R. H. Roberts, USNA, of 1073 North Woodward ave., Birmingham, arrived in New York July 2 and was granted liberty over the Fourth of July weekend while aboard the aircraft carrier USS Leyte.

He is participating in the first of two aircraft carrier cruises in the Atlantic that were planned for this summer. These two-week cruises were scheduled as a part of the summer training program to give Naval Academy midsalman men of the class of 1951 practical shipboard training and an opportunity to "earn by doing" as well as a broader insight into Naval aviation.

They have been integrated with a series of Air Cruises around the United States and several weeks of indoctrinal training at the Academy.

He embarked aboard the Leyte June 24 along with 200 other midsalman and will return to the Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., July 11.
