

**New Austin Convertible on Display Here**



The streamlined 38-horsepower Austin "Atlantic" convertible, which established 63 official AAA speed records earlier this year at Indianapolis, has just been placed on display here for the first time at the showrooms of Falvey Sales & Service, Woodward and Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills.

Powered by a four-cylinder high compression overhead valve engine, it has flowing lines that sweep through the front and rear fenders, a curved windshield, genuine leather upholstery, and four speeds forward with synchromesh in the top three gears.

This stock model Austin "Atlantic" was driven continuously at Indianapolis in April for seven days and nights through extremely bad weather. It covered 11,850 miles at an average speed of 75.54 miles per hour, including all stops. Top speed of the car is near 100 M.P.H.

Three passengers may ride in the front seat, and there is room for two more in the auxiliary rear seat. Instrument controls are centrally located on the dash, there are two glove compartments, and there are small parcel pockets in the doors.

Victor Sarkisian (BTC) defeated George Ross (W) 6-2, 6-3, while Richard Gray (BTC) and former University of Kansas southpaw took the measure of Al Coultutt (W) 6-2, 6-1.

Only one match was played in the women's division in which Dolly Milbrand, 8th ranking player in the girls' division of the entire Western Lawn Tennis Association's five state area, defeated Elizabeth Diebel of Windsor, 6-4, 6-1.

In the men's double Coppel and Sarkisian (BTC) defeated Van Buren and Perry (W) by scores of 6-4 and 6-2. Leon Bramley and Ed Dingler (BTC) won from Currie and Pollard of Windsor in a marathon, 9-7, 6-1. Birmingham's only loss was suffered by Richard Fresh and Richard Thornburn when they were defeated 6-1 and

6-3 by Windsor's Mike Waszynym and Stan Fletcher.

The Windsor Club has been invited to play a return match on the Birmingham courts later in the season.

As is their custom, the ladies of the Windsor Tennis Club served tea and sandwiches at four.
